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Programme Specific Outcome B.A. Hons Deptt. of Political Science

Political Science is a dynamic discipline aspiring to impart knowledge on various contemporary issues of politics - local, national and global. Political ideas and ideologies are very important pillars of this discipline. Issues like rights, equality, justice, liberty and their inter-relationship, nationalism, internationalism, secular politics acquire primacy in it. Ideologies like Marxism, liberalism, Gandhism, Fascism, feminism, ecologism, even communalism also occupy important positions in this subject. Students get ample opportunity to study pioneers in this field -both Indian and Western-like Plato, Aristotle, Bodin, Machiavelli, Hobbes, Locke, Rousseau, Laski, Mill, Karl Marx, Kautilya, Rammohan Roy, Bankim, Vivekananda, Ambedkar, Gandhi, Rabindranath Tagore. Public administration and local self government, good governance - are given due importance. Besides, the nature of state and democracy, social movements from different schools are discussed at length.

International institutions and issues find an important position in this course. UNO, Regional organizations like SAARC, ASEAN, NATO -composition and functions, global world order, terrorism, war, peace-keeping process, international institutions like IMF, World Bank, World Trade Organization -their power and functions get prominence in this discipline. Indian foreign policy and her relations with the neighboring countries are taught.

Moreover, for the budding scholars research methodology is a handy topic. They are given exposure on preparing PhD thesis and research methods.

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COURSE SPECIFIC OUTCOME Political Science (Hons)

SEMESTER-I

HCC-1: WESTERN POLITICAL THOUGHT

This paper consists of political thought of various western thinkers on political philosophy. After completion of this paper the students will get the exposure to the western political thought and thinkers.

They will learn about different shades of political thought; students will have the opportunity to learn the different periods, features of the society, pattern of thinking, basic ideas of different thinkers and philosophers. The students will also learn the interplay between the ideas and society; the role of political philosophers.

HCC-2 POLITICAL THEORY

This paper consists of various theories on state and politics. The students will have the opportunity to learn the basics of political theory like its scope and nature, different types of theory, political issues, ideologies, nature and role of the states. Emergence of political theory, its decline, resurgence, meaning and nature of politics, approaches to the study of politics, political ideas like liberty, equality, rights, justice, types of political belief systems- Marxism, Gandhism, Fascism, Anarchism, even the end of ideology. In short, students will have the opportunity to learn the basics of political theory.

SEMESTER-II

HCC-3: INDIAN POLITICAL THOUGHT

This paper consists of political thinking of various Indian thinkers and philosophers from ancient to the modern period. The students will learn about different patterns of political thinking and their nature. The nature of different periods and the interplay between the society and ideas - comprise the crux of the paper. The students will also learn the periodical division of Indian political thought. For example, early political thought, medieval political thought and modern political thought. This paper provides an opportunity to learn the distinguishing features of Indian political thought. How nationalism and reconstruction of the society influence the Indian thinkers and their response to the demands of the times - comprise the basic ingredients of this paper and the learners are expected to learn this.

HCC-4: INDIAN GOVERNMENT AND POLITICS

This paper is about Indian government and politics. The students will learn about the constitutional features, development and making of the constitution in independent India. Apart from that, the students learn about the fundamental rights and duties; political and public institutions (like union and state legislature, union and state executive, judiciary), their composition, functions, ideas and ideologies that shape independent Indian democracy and influence the behaviour of the government. In addition to that, they will learn on centre-state relationships (legislative, administrative and financial), directive principles of state policy, party system, coalition government and on election commission etc.

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SEM-III



HCC-5: COMPARATIVE POLITICS

This paper is about comparative government and politics. After finishing this paper the students will learn about the comparison between the constitutions of various countries. The students learn how comparative government transformed into comparative politics. The students also learn about rule of law in UK and bill of rights in USA, about unitary systems in UK and France and federal system in USA, about parliamentary system in UK and presidential system in USA and China, about party system in UK, USA, France, Nigeria and Mexico. Apart from the legislature and judiciary in UK and USA, rights and opportunities in those countries.

HCC-6: PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

This paper is about public administration. This paper offers the students to learn about meaning, evolution and identity crisis of public administration. The students also learn on classical theory of public administration- such as scientific management by Taylor, Administrative Management by Gullick and Urwick and bureaucratic theory by Weber. And also learn on Neo classical theory of public administration- such as Human Relation by Mayo, Decision Making by Simon and Motivation Theory by Herzbeg and Maslow. Moreover, the students learn about contemporary theories of public administration- such as Ecological Approach by Riggs, Innovation and Entrepreneurship by Peter Drucker. They will learn various concepts of public administration- such as hierarchy, span of control, unity of command, line and staff agencies, centralisation, decentralization, devolution and delegation. Further the students learn about New public administration, new public management, new public service approach and feminist perspective in public administration.

HCC-7: LOCAL GOVERNMENT IN INDIA

This paper is about local government in India. After completion of this paper the students will learn about the 73rd constitution amendment act and 74th constitution amendment act, Panchayati Raj institutions, Municipality and Municipal corporation in West Bengal, role of BDO, urban administration in West Bengal, municipal corporation, role of district magistrate, police super and sub divisional officer. In addition to that, the student will learn about the chief secretary and divisional commissioner. Further the students will learn about administrative reforms in India, impact of globalization, right to information act, Lokpal and lokayukta.

SEC-1

LEGISLATIVE SUPPORT

This paper is about legislative practices and behaviour. Students will get the opportunity to learn about the power and functions of MP and MLA, law making procedure and role of different parliamentary committees, parliamentary budget, ministry and working of ministry, role of speaker, MPLAD and other schemes.

HCC-8: INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

This paper is about International Relations. Issues like national power, balance of power, origin and end of the cold war, different theoretical schools to study international relations and world politics. Post-cold war global issues- like globalization, human rights and terrorism will also be taught to the students. Moreover, the student will learn about disarmament and various nuclear treaty like- NPT, CTBT and NSG. They will be acquainted with the different approaches, such as, idealist approach, realist approach, neo-realist approach in international relations. Further, students will learn about foreign policy and diplomacy and also learn about India's foreign policy. After completion of this paper the students will learn about the nature and scope of international relations and its basic concepts

HCC-9: SOCIOLOGY AND POLITICS

This paper is about the interplay between sociology and politics. This paper opens up the opportunity before the student to learn about the nature and scope of Political Sociology, the difference between Political sociology and Sociology of Politics. Issues which touch upon the periphery of society and politics will come up for discussion. Issues like -power, authority, domination, political culture, political socialization, secularism, communalism, recent trends of feminism, environmentalism Further, they will learn about political participation, role of media, interaction between state and civil society. In short, the students will get the exposure of those issues which come under the purview of state and society.

HCC-10: INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

International organizations comprise the crux of this paper. The students will learn the evolution and role of the international and regional organizations like UNO, APEC, OPEC, SAARC, ASEAN, BRICS etc.. Further, they will learn about the composition of UNO and its different organs like- General Assembly, Security Council, Secretariat and General Secretary and International Court of Justice. Besides, they also learn how the UNO maintains peace-keeping operations throughout the world. They will get the opportunity to learn about various regional economic organizations like- APEC and OPEC, various regional security organizations like- NATO and ARF and various regional organizations like- SAARC, ASEAN and BRICS.

SEC-2

DEMOCRATIC AWARENESS THROUGH LEGAL LITERACY

This paper is about democratic awareness through legal literacy. After completion of this paper the students will learn about fundamental rights and duties and other constitutional rights. They also know different laws relating to dowry system, sexual harassment and violence against women. Further, they learn about anti terrorist law and about various system courts, tribunals, Juvenile courts, mahila courts and their jurisdiction in India. Besides, they know about alternative dispute mechanisms like Lok Adalats and non-formal mechanisms for adjudication.

It is a unique opportunity to learn the differences of opinion and thoughts about the same issues like social justice, Swaraj, Democracy, Equality, Rights, liberty, Citizenship. Kautilya, Tilak, Gandhi, Ambedkar, Nehru and Jayprakash Narayan, Aristotle, Locke, Rousseau, and J.S.Mill. A comparative discussion on these issues and by the western and orient thinkers will always be there.

DSE-2: DEMOCRACY AND DECENTRALISED GOVERNANCE

Democracy and decentralized governance is the crux of this paper. After completion of this paper the students will learn about how the present state evolved through the ages and how the sovereign state came into being. Further they learn about various Bretton Woods Institutions- WB, IMF and WTO. Apart from this, they learn about the role of different MNCs throughout the world. The students will also learn about SDGs, New social movements and the role of NGOs.

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
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CC-1D: INDIAN GOVERNMENT AND POLITICS

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
