Chandidas Mahavidyalaya, a rural college, was set up in 04.01.1972 in a remote village Khujutipara under Bolpur Sub-division in the district of Birbhum of West Bengal. The objective behind establishing this college in the rural areas was to open up the opportunity of higher education before the first generation learners coming from economically and socially backward and minority families of the locality. But at the same time modern, scientific and value based education is necessary for the students and the society at large. So college judiciously blends the twin objectives- modern, secular & value education- into its vision. The journey of more than four decades was not always a smooth one. The bumpy and rough weather sometimes hampered the institutional performance, but the passion and dedication of the teachers and staff facilitated the college to overcome all obstacles and redeemed its pledge to carry on its tasks in imparting knowledge to the students and empowering them to face the future challenges. The persistent, perseverance and firm approach of the faculties and the management helped to tide over the crisis.

6) Teaching & Learning:

Before beginning of the session, academic calendar is prepared after wide consultation with the faculties, college authority and iqac. Class days, exam dates, seminar schedule, study tours are detailed in the academic calendar including holiday lists.

Departments meet prior to the commencement of new session. Syllabus is distributed among the faculties. Subject aptitude test is taken for classification of students and preparation of teaching plan. Modules are prepared.

ICT based teaching learning has got priority among the faculty members. Initially the teachers were found to be reluctant and after persuasion by the IQAC, faculty members started finding interest and its utility in class-room teaching. At present the institution has 4 smart class rooms with modern teaching tools with internet facility.


a) Academic resources:



7) Students' Assessment & Progression

Mapping students' progress is the sole criteria of the successful teachinglearning. In this regard institution adopts continuous evaluation system starting from subject aptitude test to internal test.regular class test, project writing, excursion, subject quiz, students seminar are implemented to gauge the performance of the students. Test result is discussed and analysed and students are informed accordingly. Remedial measures are taken to address the problem, if found.

Regular evaluation done. Internal test centrally taken. Results analysed and discussed in proper forum. Poor students are taken care of. Career counselling also time to time taken parents-teachers meeting organized.

We introduced the mentoring system in 2016 keeping the crises students face in mind. Nowadays students in the teen age face innumerable crisis in life which hamper their academic and professional aspiration. Iqac resolved in 2016 that mentoring system should be introduced to help the students overcome their different crisis- like emotional, socio-cultural, academic and professional. We continue the mentoring system for the honours students. All the honours students are divided among groups and each group of students is placed under one faculty. Students are informed about their mentor. On regular basis mentor discusses with them various issues and try to sort out and find an amicable solution.




Modalities followed for organizing meeting with the parents:
